CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

I most recently spoke to a young man, 34 years old, who was a graduate of a Catholic grade school and Notre Dame High School. He told me he was very proud to have gone to both schools, but when he told others that he went to Catholic schools, they would often criticize him. Moreover, he indicated that he oftentimes hears criticism of the Catholic Faith and believes that there are powerful forces in our society that would like to get rid of the influence of religion, especially the Catholic religion. He said it wounds him deeply when he hears of attacks against the Church.

When I was a grade school student, I remember a sister telling my class that the KKK had attacked a church and that the Knights of Columbus were called to protect church property. This was my earliest impression of the Knights; they were defenders of the faith. I think that the defense of our faith is much needed today, and I hope that the Knights will continue to be a voice standing up against unjustified criticism of our faith and church. To do this, though, one has to be versed in the teachings of our faith and be able, if need be, to explain it and defend it. That is my challenge to you: to learn to become Defenders of the Faith in our times as were the Knights of Columbus in the past.
